Appendix A (KCC Review of the Year 2024/25)

Club membership remains at around 180 members, with some new faces replacing the ones who have moved on. We remain proud of our inclusive and diverse club and try to provide something for everyone.

This year the club year started with a gravel fundraising event organised by Brad. The event was titled a Sunday in Hell and all funds raised were donated to Fife Greyhound Rescue. The sun shone and there were loads of mud and big smiles. And all the baking was eaten.

Another good Sportive Kinross was run using a slightly different route owing to condition of Craigmead. We have now been able to donate a total of around £110k to our charity partner CHAS. Huge thanks to the Sportive committee and volunteers who make this happen.

In springtime we also offered a course of gravel coaching, led by Keith Stocker. There was universal praise from all who attended. Gravel riding has become more popular with our members and Brad has organised a few urban adventures to explore the paths less travelled around Edinburgh. Curry at the mosque kitchen is a treat!

Club rides have been well supported and we continue to offer a traditional Sunday club run and two runs on Saturdays (one in winter): these cater for all abilities and involve a café stop. A wet summer didn't improve turnout at times...

We have also organised ride leader training and a first aid course to support rider development and safety.

Kirsteen Durkin has run some coach led fitness training sessions at Fife Cycle Park to help boost our rider skills and keep us motivated over winter.

We held another club Grand Prix time trial series this year but turnout was disappointing and we had very few riders actually complete the series. It would be great to see more

involvement and some new faces in 2025 if we are to justify organising these events and marshalling the courses in to the future. It is relaxed and informal. No need for a fancy bike and kit. Just you against the clock. There are some excellent trophies up for grabs too for entering our series, including the Craig Johnston veterans' trophy. This year our women's league was won by Ashleigh McManus; Thomas Jacquemet won the men's league and Frank Chalmers was veterans' trophy winner (which is adjusted for both age and sex).

Funds raised from donations for the cake were donated to Broke not Broken, who we have supported on a regular basis.

There is also the Wednesday evening time trial series organised by Fife Cycle Association. Thank you to volunteers who have helped with marshalling obligations for these events over the year.

Our annual awards session was held at Fife Cycle Park in November and the weather gods were favourable for an hour of coach led activities followed by home baking and awards. We celebrate diverse talents at our awards day and it always a treat to watch someone's expression when they have won something they weren't expecting... (Jeff Wall had the best face this year)

Everything offered by KCC depends on support for volunteers who organise club rides and events, who stand on corners and roundabouts in the rain so others can race, and who are generous with their skills and time for the benefit of others. You know who you are, and we thank you from the bottom of our hearts.
